Subject: Public consultation on strengthened cooperation against vaccine preventable diseases

EPRUMA welcomes DG SANTE's initiative to strengthen EU citizens' awareness about the benefits of vaccination, and notices that the current public consultation on 'Strengthened cooperation against vaccine preventable diseases' does not cover vaccination in veterinary medicine, an essential element of a One Health approach.

Vaccination hesitation and public awareness

Vaccination hesitation is a trend in veterinary practice, and public awareness of the benefits of animal vaccination is limited.

However, vaccines are instrumental to prevent and control a wide range of animal diseases including those that can pass from animals to people (zoonoses), e.g. rabies, listeria and salmonella. Equally, the vaccination of farm animals contributes to public health as healthy animals provide safe food. Additionally, vaccination, as part of an overall animal health plan, helps prevent disease and minimises the need for antibiotic use, contributing to the fight against antimicrobial resistance, and supports sustainable livestock production. EPRUMA firmly promotes vaccination as a tool for ensuring animal health, supporting animal welfare, and contributing to food safety and public health.

One Health strategy

Vaccination is an indispensable tool for all health professionals including veterinarians. We call on the EU institutions

- to support research and innovation for veterinary vaccines
- to increase their availability in all Member States for all species, including minor ones, and
- to increase public awareness of the benefits of animal vaccination as part of a One Health strategy.
