New chair for EPRUMA

Brussels, 22 October 2019: The European Platform for the Responsible Use of Medicines in Animals (EPRUMA) is pleased to announce its newly elected chair Steve Hallahan, a veterinary surgeon from Ireland.

Representing the Federation of European Companion Animal Veterinary Associations, the new chair adds a renewed impetus to the platform's promotion of the responsible use of *all* medicines in *all* animals.

"EPRUMA is about more than just responsible use of antibiotics in farm animals. Taking a One Health perspective in our work means that we also promote the responsible use of vaccines, antiparasitics, and indeed all the other solutions available for ensuring optimal animal health. Use of medicines in animals must also be supported by a comprehensive and holistic planning, whether that's ensuring regular vet check-ups for companion animals or establishing a farm management plan with vets and other agricultural advisers," said Steve Hallahan.

The refreshed lead of EPRUMA comes at a good time when the efforts to increase awareness on the need to use medicines, particularly antibiotics, responsibly are generating success at European level. The latest ESVAC report from the European Medicines Agency highlights a decrease by more than 32% of the overall sales of veterinary antimicrobials between 2011 and 2017, for the 25 countries across Europe that provided data during this period. The report also notes a decline in the use of antibiotics that are classified as being of critical importance to human health. It is clear that continued focus on an ever more responsible use of medicines in animals can deliver to benefit the health of Europe's animals, its people and our environment.
